# **Automated telephone system**

The new automated telephone system for booking same day urgent appointments has been running for a short while now. Despite some teething problems to begin with we are confident patients will find this beneficial.

When you call the Practice, selecting option 1 will allow you to book using the automated system. In order to use this service you will have been sent a PIN code, which you will need to enter to book an appointment. The automated service allows you to record a message giving a brief summary of your problem in order for the correct appointment type to be allocated for you. This may be a telephone consultation or where deemed necessary, a face to face appointment. If you have lost or forgotten your PIN, you can ask for it to be resent to your registered mobile number via our website or ask a member of our reception team.

This new automated system should ease the burden on the telephone system for those people who need to speak directly to a member of staff.

## **Appointment system**

Following patient feedback, there have been improvements to our appointment system, which should make it easier for you to book appointments and get in touch with the Surgery over the telephone, or through our website.

To request an urgent on the day appointment, please phone 01827 69283 and speak to a member of the reception team or press option 1 for our automated system, these appointments open daily at 8am. Once all appointments have been allocated for the day you will be directed to NHS 111, the minor ailment scheme at pharmacies or minor injuries unit as appropriate.

If your request is not urgent for the day, please submit an appointment request on our website at <a href="https://www.laurelhousesurgery.co.uk">www.laurelhousesurgery.co.uk</a> using the 'get help for any health problem' form on the home page.

If you do not have access to the internet, please speak to our reception team and they will submit the online form on your behalf, we aim to respond to online requests within 48 working hours.

We hope this improves access to the Practice and will be a positive change for our patients. If you have any queries on the new system please contact us and a member of our team will be more than happy to assist.

### Summertime Health

During the summer months it is important that you take care of yourself in the sun even in the UK. Please take extra care for those who are most vulnerable and make sure you use adequate sun protection.

If you are travelling abroad and may require travel vaccinations, please make sure you submit a 'Travel risk assessment form' at least 6 weeks before your travel date in order for us to be able to accommodate vaccinations before you are due to travel. 	Sun safety UV levels
UV Level	Description
1-2	Low exposure. No protection required. You can safely stay outside
3-5	Moderate exposure. Seek shade during mid- day hours, cover up and wear sunscreen
6-7	High exposure. Seek shade during midday hours, cover up and wear sunscreen
8-10	Very high. Avoid being outside during midday hours. Shirt, sunscreen and hat are essential
11 or over	Extreme. Avoid being outside during midday hours. Shirt, sunscreen and hat essential.

# **Update from the Patient Participation Group (PPG)**

Welcome to all patients of Laurel House Surgery

This is the very first combined Newsletter from both sides, so to speak, and hopefully you will find it a useful platform to keep you all up to date with what's happening at the Practice.

Quarterly meetings, are now resuming following both Covid and a change of management, and minutes of the meetings will appear on the PPG and Practice Websites once they've been approved by both the Surgery and PPG.

The Practice is busy recruiting new clinical staff, such as a Practice Nurse, Pharmacist and Advanced Nurse Practitioner and as you can see on P1, we had some new arrivals. Just like other Practices around the country, Laurel House is experiencing similar issues in recruiting new staff but I can assure you that they are doing their utmost to recruit additional members of the team. We would urge you to bear with us at these difficult times. When contacting the Practice, it will help your case if you can answer any questions when asked as this will ensure you are seen by the most appropriate medical practitioner.

As a Group we are here to help you, the patients', ensure your voices are heard and feedback to the Surgery, and feedback where we might see something we believe could be improved/provided for patients to benefit from the services.

Some things that concern both the Surgery and us is the drop off in immunisation rates and this is especially noticeable in childhood immunisation rates. These have dropped to just under 90%, despite the World Health

Organisation recommending a 95% immunisation rate. Recently there has been a rise in the number of cases of measles, with an alert that there was a case in Birmingham recently, and this is a worry. Since the introduction of the measles vaccine in 1968 it is estimated that 20 million measles cases and 4,500 deaths have been prevented in the UK. Please contact the Practice to book your child's immunisations.

During our meetings we do discuss worries like this and wonder how we can communicate these concerns to patients and whilst we can update noticeboards in the Surgery, post them on websites and social media sites, we'd like to hear from you, the patients, how best we can communicate issues to you. We appreciate that not everyone is on the internet, not like the government where literally these days we are pointed to! We will use whatever media is appropriate to get the message across.

Another area the Practice would like to increase uptake of is cervical smears, the test can help prevent cancer by detecting early changes. If you are due for your smear, please contact the Practice via telephone or us the link on P2 to arrange an appointment,

We hope you've found this issue and information within it useful, but do feedback any comments - see bottom P4 on how to do this.
